

THE PURPOSE & GOAL OF THE LEADERSHIP TEAM

Home Group Leadership Team

The Home Group Leadership Team's purpose is to shepherd and oversee the Home Groups and Home Group Facilitators. The Team communicates the vision and values for CCLV and for the Home Group Studies. Additionally, the Home Group Team establishes an accountability relationship with each of the Home Group Facilitators. The role is summed up in the bullet points below.

- Must attend at least one CCLV service weekly.
- Must be in support of the Senior Pastor and vision of CCLV.
- Pray for the Church, the ministries and Home Group Studies.
- Pray for, help identify, train and disciple Group Facilitators.
- Offer support to Group Facilitators as needed.
- Assist in resolving challenges that a Group Facilitator may experience.
- Communicate leadership information to Group Facilitators.
- Encourage and disciple Group Facilitators by prayer and weekly contact.
- Review each Home Group's weekly status report.
- Share and report status and concerns to the Men's Ministry Leader.
- Assist in multiplication of Home Groups throughout the Las Vegas valley.
- Members of this team are invited to serve at the discretion of the pastoral team.

THE PURPOSE & GOAL OF FACILITATORS AND HOSTS

Group Facilitators

A Group Facilitator's primary role is to shepherd the Home Group and Co-Facilitators. Group Facilitators are to stay in touch with the Co-Facilitators and the entire group to provide support, encouragement, and prayer. Group Facilitators also provide a communication link from the Home Group Overseer to the group. The Group Facilitator accepts responsibility for his/her group. He/She facilitates the meeting time and fosters an environment for disciples to grow and flourish. The Group Facilitator also promotes the vision and growth of the Home Group ministry by investing in a Co-Facilitator. The Group Facilitator will continuously look for opportunities to grow new Home Groups with the assistance of the Co-Facilitator and the Home Group Overseer. Group Facilitator requirements are as follows:

- Must attend at least one CCLV service weekly.
- Must be in support of the Senior Pastor and vision of CCLV.
- Pray for the Church, Church Ministries, the Home Group Studies and the members in the study.
- Lead and guide the reading of Scripture as well as direct and lead the subsequent discussions ensuring the proper interpretation and application of the scripture.
- Pray for, train and disciple Co-Facilitators from within the group.
- Offer support to Co-Facilitators as needed.
- Assist in resolving challenges that the group may be facing.
- Identify prospective Group Facilitators, Co-Facilitators and hosts.
- Encourage those within the group through prayer and weekly contact.
- Share and report the group's status and concerns to the Home Group Overseer.

Co-Facilitator

The Co-Facilitator is responsible for assisting the Group Facilitator. He/She will offer assistance in any way to the Group Facilitator. The Co-Facilitator will be challenged and practically equipped by the Group Facilitator to develop into a Group Facilitator; even at times filling in for the Group Facilitator as needed or requested by the Group Facilitator. The Co-Facilitator will assist the Group Facilitator in looking for opportunities to grow new Home Groups. The role of the Co-Facilitator is summed up in the following.

- Must attend at least one CCLV service weekly.
- Must be in support of the Senior Pastor and vision of CCLV.
- Pray for the Church, Church Ministries, the Home Group Studies and the people in the study.
- Disciple those in the group, leading by example (2 Tim 2:2, Phil 3:17).
- Support and encourage group members in their continued growth and walk with Christ (1 Thess. 5:11).
- Communicate the vision of the Home Group Studies.
- Help create a sense of family and accountability to each other (Rom 12:5).
- Relate to the group by being real, honest and genuine (Mark 12:14).

Group Host *(When the Group Facilitator or Co-Facilitator is not the Host)*

A group host is someone who has offered to arrange for the group meeting to be held at his/her home. Displaying the gift of hospitality, the host honors the Lord by creating a



safe, friendly and welcoming environment for the group. The Group Host works in partnership with the Group Facilitator and Co-Facilitator to assure the success of the group and advancement of the vision.
